Motion to recommend that the Rock Island County Board adopt an ordinance prohibiting the sale, distribution, and marketing of products containing 7-hydroxymitragynine and mitragynine pseudoindoxyl, synthetic or naturally derived, which are found in products commonly marketed as Kratom, within Rock Island County.

# Background of the Agenda Package

#### **New Business**

- a) The Community Health Assessment and Community Health Improvement Plan were developed through a collaborative process involving local stakeholders, partners, and residents. These documents identify key health priorities and outline a five-year strategic roadmap to improve community health outcomes. Board approval is required for formal adoption and implementation.
- b) The Organizational Self-Assessment Plan provides a structured framework to evaluate the Health Department's internal capacity, workforce development, operational efficiency, and readiness to meet public health priorities. This plan supports continuous quality improvement and aligns with state and national public health standards. Board approval is requested to formally adopt the plan and proceed with implementation.
- c) The Illinois Administrative Code (77 Ill. Adm. Code 600.400) requires that a Certified Local Health Department designate an Executive Officer who meets the qualifications outlined in Section 600.310 to oversee the submission of the Illinois Project for Local Assessment of Needs (IPLAN). George Verástegui meets these qualifications and has been appointed by the Board of Health to serve as the Public Health Administrator. This action formally designates him as the Executive Officer for IPLAN purposes.
- d) These vehicles have exceeded their useful service life and are no longer cost-effective to maintain. The Health Department recommends disposal through public auction, recycling, or other appropriate means as allowed by county policy. Board approval is required to formally declare the vehicles as surplus and authorize their disposal.
- e) Kratom (Mitragyna speciosa) and its derivatives, including **7-hydroxymitragynine** and **mitragynine pseudoindoxyl**, are increasingly associated with health risks, including dependence, overdose, and interactions with other substances. These compounds are not FDA-approved for any medical use, and their unregulated sale poses a threat to public health and safety. The Board of Health is requesting that the County Board consider an ordinance to restrict their sale and protect residents, especially youth and vulnerable populations, from harm.
